Fifth Week of March: Let's Transform the World Inspired by Holy Spirit (Acts 6:1~7)

■ Welcome

The Bible describes Philip as a “preacher”. How would like others to describe you? Also, please share how God touched your heart through Grace Time this week.

■ Text: Acts 6:1~7

■ Introduction

Following the Lord's command to “**be fruitful, conquer, and rule,**” we have been looking at people of faith who served to spread the Gospel to the world and make disciples of all nations.

Today, we want to focus on Philip. He is not the Apostle Philip, one of Jesus' twelve disciples, but rather an ordinary deacon who served in the early church in Jerusalem. As the Jerusalem church grew rapidly, seven people were appointed to oversee the church's ministry of relief, and Philip was one of them. Though his ministry began with serving the church, a life filled with the Holy Spirit led him into an even broader calling.

“Philip journeyed to Samaria, a place Jews typically avoided, and became an instrument of great revival (Acts 8:5). Guided by the Holy Spirit to a wilderness road, he led an Ethiopian eunuch to faith, opening a door for the Gospel to expand into new lands (Acts 8:26-39). Through the obedience of an ordinary believer, a city was transformed and a continent was reached. This legacy earned him the biblical title, ‘Philip the Evangelist.’”

(Acts 21:8) “**Leaving the next day, we reached Caesarea and stayed at the house of Philip the evangelist, one of the Seven.**”

Through the life of Philip, we intend to explore the journey of faith and the kind of influence a person can have when they are truly used by the Holy Spirit.

■ Observation Question: Who was Philip, an ordinary follower of Christ who accomplished remarkable thing in the Bible?

Answer 1. He was a man full of the Spirit and wisdom

After Pentecost, the Jerusalem church experienced an explosive revival. As this growth increased, new problems arose within the church. Complaints surfaced that Grecian widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food, causing conflict within the community.



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(Acts 6:1) **“In those days when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenistic Jews among them complained against the Hebraic Jews because their widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food.”**

At this time, the apostles decided to appoint seven men to take charge of the church’s relief work so they could focus on the Word and prayer. The criteria set by the apostles were that they be men full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom.

(Acts 6:3) **“Brothers and sisters, choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom.”**

The wisdom the Bible refers to is the wisdom from above that discerns God’s heart and brings peace to the community. Therefore, a person with true wisdom is not someone who escalates conflicts, but someone who solves problems and builds up the community.

(Acts 6:5) **“This proposal pleased the whole group. They chose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit; also Philip...”**

Through the service of Deacon Philip, who was full of the Holy Spirit, the internal conflict was resolved, and peace returned to the community. A Spirit-filled person is not a troublemaker, but a problem solver. Furthermore, a Spirit-filled person is one who hears and obeys the voice of the Holy Spirit. Regardless of their position, when someone is filled with the Spirit, God uses them as a channel for His work, opening the doors of nations and changing the course of history.

❁ Application Question 1

- 1) Philip was a man full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom. If you were to compare your current state of mind to the weather, what would it look like?
- 2) What are your areas of improvement in order to become a problem solver like Philip?

Answer 2. He was a man who, led by the Holy Spirit, conquered the land with the Gospel.

After the martyrdom of Stephen, a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, causing the believers to scatter throughout all the land. Wherever these scattered saints went, they began to spread the Gospel.

(Acts 8:1, 4) **“And Saul approved of their killing him. On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria... Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went.”**

At that time, Deacon Philip, led by the Holy Spirit, went down to Samaria—a place Jews typically avoided—and began to preach the Gospel. Then, amazing things started to happen.

(Acts 8:6-8) **“When the crowds heard Philip and saw the signs he performed, they all paid close attention to what he said. For with shrieks, impure spirits came out of many, and many who were paralyzed or lame were healed. So there was great joy in that city.”**

When the Gospel enters, darkness collapses, bound souls find freedom, and those in despair experience a new kind of joy.



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Afterward, following the guidance of the Holy Spirit, Philip went down to the desert road and met an Ethiopian eunuch, an important official in charge of all the treasury of the Kandake (Queen of the Ethiopians). Seeing the eunuch reading the Book of Isaiah on his chariot, Philip explained the scriptures to him, taught him about Jesus Christ, shared the Gospel, and even baptized him. Through him, the door to Gentile missions began to open for the first time in the Book of Acts.

❁ Application Question 2

- 1) Philip broke through prejudice and went to Samaria. Who or where is the “person” or “place” I need to approach first with warmth, setting aside my own preconceptions
- 2) Led by the Holy Spirit, Philip went into the desert to help just one Ethiopian eunuch. This week, who is the one person who truly needs my sincere comfort and care?

Answer 3. He the fruit of the gospel through obedience.

Philip’s obedience saved lives, built up the church, and ultimately became part of the history. As an ordinary deacon faithfully serving the church, his ministry helped establish the Jerusalem church. This allowed the apostles to devote themselves to the Word and prayer, strengthening the entire community. Moreover, he established God’s rule not only in the church but also in his home. In Acts 21, when Paul arrived in Caesarea, he stayed at Philip’s house:

(Acts 21:8-9) **“The next day we left and came to Caesarea, and we entered the house of Philip the evangelist, who was one of the seven, and stayed with him. He had four unmarried daughters who prophesied.”**

This shows that he lived as a witness—an evangelist—devoted till the end, and was also a father who raised his children in faith. True spiritual influence does not end with an individual’s ministry; it extends to the family and continues to the next generation.

In addition, his ministry in Samaria awakened the apostles, who had remained in Jerusalem. It became a spark that revealed God’s will—that the gospel should not remain among the Jews alone, but go beyond Samaria to the ends of the earth.

The gospel he shared with the Ethiopian eunuch in the desert also led to an even greater work. Ethiopia, where one of the first Gentile missions began, became one of the first Christian nations.

A life that obeys the guidance of the Holy Spirit is never small. Though it may seem small at first, that obedience becomes a channel through which the church is built, the next generation is awakened, and even the course of a nation’s history is changed. God fulfills and advances His kingdom through one person who obeys Him.

❁ Application Question 3

- 1) Philip was an evangelist in the community and a father who modeled faith to his children at home. What kind of “example of faith” do I want to show within my family.
