2nd Week of May: Let US Build a Little Heaven Where God Reigns (Philippian 2:1-4)

■ Welcome

What was the happiest moment you have ever had with your family in your life? Let's each share one of those moments. Let's also share one thing you received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Philippian 2:1-4

2 Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, **2** then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. **3** Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, **4** not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

■ Introduction

May is known as Family Month because it includes both Mother's Day and Children's Day (Korean holiday). The family is an institution that God established before the church or the nation. He created it for human happiness, multiplication, and protection. We are born within the shelter of a family. There we are nurtured, protected, and raised. And until the day we die, we live within this shelter called family before going to heaven.

Therefore, family is extremely important. Within the family, we are meant to receive love and experience happiness through that love. However, not every family is filled with happiness, love, and joy. In many cases, even family members—who should be the closest and love one another the most—become like enemies and avoid each other. In such situations, it may seem as though having no family would be better.

* Results from a U.S. family survey on the causes of family problems and conflicts in 2025:

1. Economic factors (the biggest cause), 2. Relationship and emotional factors, /3. Mental health and the digital environment

In this kind of reality, when we live according to the teachings of Philippians chapter 2, we can overcome conflict. Heavenly order is established within the family, grace overflows, and heaven comes upon that home

■ Observation Question: How do you make a happy family?

Answer 1. You must be filled with God's grace (verse 1).

(Philippians 4:2) **“I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord.”** It appears that there was a conflict within the Philippian church. In addition to these two female leaders, there were others in the church who were not getting along and were arguing with one another. Before giving specific instructions regarding the issue, Paul first reminds them of the grace they had already received: **encouragement in Christ, comfort from love, fellowship of the Spirit, compassion, and mercy.**

First, **there is encouragement in Christ.** “Encouragement” here means comfort and exhortation. When believers receive the Holy Spirit, God’s love is poured into their hearts, producing not only love for the Lord but also **a desire to love others.** God also gives the comfort of love. He comforts the soul with His love. When life becomes difficult and painful, experiencing God’s love removes fear, pain, anger, and wounds, and true comfort comes upon the believers.

Also, the Holy Spirit speaks and leads through fellowship. Through that process, believers gain spiritual strength. The Lord’s compassion and mercy continue to be poured out. Paul tells the believers who are in conflict to remember the grace they have received. He exhorts them to yield to one another, forgive one another, love one another, and live in harmony through the grace they have received.

✿ Application Question 1

1) If you are currently experiencing conflict or a difficult relationship with a family member or someone close to you, how can the grace you received from God (comfort, love, compassion) can provide the strength to restore that relationship?

Answer 2. We must be of one mind (verse 2).

Verse 2 is filled with words that emphasize unity. Most family conflicts begin with differences of opinion. However, when people become united in the will of the Lord, conflict disappears. Since the true head of the family is Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit Himself rules over the family. In the book of Acts, conflict arose over the issue of the Gentiles—whether Gentiles who believed in Jesus should also keep the Law. At that time, the apostles and leaders gathered together, made a decision, and became united according to God’s will. Families must also become one according to God’s will. In every situation, unity should be achieved by following God’s will. However, when God’s will is not clear, we should follow the order that God has established. In the family, the husband is the head of the household. Therefore, the wife and children should submit to the husband’s decisions. Submission is not agreement, but obedience. It means following even when there is disagreement.

(1Peter 3:1), **“Wives, in the same way submit yourselves to your husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives.”**

✿ Application Question 2

1) When differences of opinion arise within your family or small group, have you ever laid aside your own stubbornness and sought together to discern “What is God’s will for this situation?” Please share your experience

Answer 3. We must be humble (verse 3).

The reason we fail to become one is pride. Because there is no humility, people argue, seek their own glory, and look down on others. Humility is recognizing that I am nothing, and therefore considering others better than myself.

Moses was a very humble man. When his brother and sister criticized him, he remained silent and entrusted all judgment to the Lord. As a result, the Lord rebuked his siblings and honored Moses. A humble person does not argue. Instead, he quietly looks to the Lord, endures, and entrusts the matter to Him. Then the Lord works.

The same is true in the family. When family members hurt or criticize them, humble people remain quiet. They entrust judgment to the Lord instead of judging for themselves. They do not repay evil for evil, but respond with goodness, kindness, and love. As a result, they overcome evil with good and pride with humility. In the end, God exalts them.

* Practical ways to practice humility:

1) Spend more time listening 2) First acknowledge your own responsibility 3) Replace entitlement with gratitude, 4) Practice unseen acts of service 5) Decrease the focus on “me” 6) Be the first to greet others

✿ Application Question 3

1) Among the “practical ways to practice humility” listed above, which one is the most difficult for you to practice, and why? Also, let’s choose one thing you can practice at home this week. Why did you choose that one?

Answer 4. I must be the first to serve (verse 4).

Lastly, happiness in the family comes when we serve one another with humility. Jesus also told His disciples to wash one another’s feet. This means that we should willingly labor and serve first in order to meet each other’s needs.

It applies to the family as well; we should take the initiative to handle unpleasant tasks without being asked and be the first to help during difficult situations. Human beings are naturally selfish. We want to be served and do not want to serve others. However, the Christian family should go in the opposite direction. We should first do onto others what we ourselves want to do for ourselves, and with serve them.

The same applies in relationships with neighbors and others. Even if no one contacts us first, we should reach out first. Even if we are not treated well, we should first show hospitality and kindness. When we look for the needs of another family and take the initiative to help and serve them, eventually we ourselves will receive in return.

✿ Application Question 4

1) Following the principle, “Do onto others what want to do for oneself,” think of the service you want to receive from your spouse, children, or neighbors. Then, this week, practice doing that for them first.
