Family church worship plan 2026. 1. 4

1st Week of January: Life Worthy to Be Present Before the Lord (Philippians 2:12-16)

Welcome

Come up with a slogan for your vision and purpose in 2026. Also, let's share one of the gracious things we received through last week's Grace Time.

Text: Philippians 2:12~16

12 Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, 13 for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose. 14 Do everything without grumbling or arguing, 15 so that you may become blameless and pure, “children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.”[a] Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky 16 as you hold firmly to the word of life. And then I will be able to boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labor in vain.

Introduction

Those who finish well are also able to begin anew with beauty and purpose. The likelihood of a successful life increases as well. In our life of faith, the end is just as important as the beginning. We must all become believers who will hear the Lord say, “Well done,” on the day we stand before God.

Let us look back on the race of faith we ran over the past year. For this race to be a source of honor before the Lord on the day we stand before Him, all our labor and devotion must be carried through faithfully and beautifully to the very end. Paul gives us clear instruction on how our faith can avoid becoming futile labor or a meaningless race. When we finally stand before God, we should be believers who have something to be proud of before the Lord—not based on the evaluation of this world, but a life worthy to be presented before Him. That is true victory and true blessing.

Observation Question: What are the things we can boast about when we stand before the Lord?

Answer 1. Keeping Our Faith

The life of a believer is like a marathon. The moment we believe in Jesus is the starting point, and the day we stand before the Lord is the finish line. Right now, we are running the course in between. The marathon of faith is not easy. The apostle Paul described it as a “good fight,” for it is filled with trials, obstacles, and constant opposition. Yet we cannot stop running. We must finish the race all the way to heaven. The strength that enables us to run this course to the end is faith alone.

We are those who have received salvation at the cost of God's Son. When we truly understand the greatness of the grace we have received, we cannot take our life of faith lightly. Living carefully and thoughtfully is the posture believers must have in the process of sanctification. When we remember this grace, we are able to run the race toward eternal heaven to the very end. And the only way to gain victory in this race is to live by faith.

Paul's boast was Christ Jesus alone—Christ and the cross alone. Therefore, at the end of his life, he was able to make this confession

(2 Timothy 4:7-8) **"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge"**

- 1) Share how you upheld your faith in your life over the past year, and in what areas you may have fallen short?
- 2) What were the outcomes of your faith?

Answer 2. Fulfilling Your Calling

A person who faithfully fulfills the mission God has entrusted to them will find that mission to be a great source of joy and honor when they stand before the Lord.

Matthew 25: The Parable of the Talents (Five, Two, and One Talent)

Jesus made this truth clear through the parable of the talents. Although the servant who received five talents and the servant who received two talents were entrusted with different amounts, they received the same praise.

(Matthew 25:21, 23) **"Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Enter into the joy of your master."**

What the Lord valued was not the size of the talents, but the attitude of faithfulness. In contrast, the servant who received one talent was rebuked—not because he was given little, but because he did nothing with what he had received. Scripture nowhere teaches that a person must hold a position in order to serve. Nor does God entrust a mission to anyone without also providing gifts. Talents represent gifts, abilities, and even the context of one's life. God has given each person exactly what is needed. What matters is how highly we value those gifts and how faithfully we use them. A mission is not carried out because of a title or position, but because of the grace we have received.

(Acts 20:23-24) **"I only know that in every city the Holy Spirit warns me that prison and hardships are facing me. However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace."**

This is the confession of one who did not abandon his mission, even knowing imprisonment and suffering awaited him. It is a confession that only a person filled with grace can make. When grace grows cold, the sense of mission also fades. When grace

disappears, service becomes a duty and mission becomes a burden. But when grace is restored, mission once again becomes a joy.

Believers must treasure the mission and talents God has entrusted to them. Without comparing what is large or small, without weighing visible roles against unseen ones, faithfully carrying out what the Lord has entrusted to us in our given place—that is what will be our boast on the day of Christ.

- 2) What must be restored in your life in order to serve the Lord better?

Answer 3. Living the life that reflects the Scripture

God gives us desires, dreams, and visions so that, led by the Holy Spirit, we may love the Lord more deeply and be used by Him. When we hold fast to His grace and live accordingly, our lives reflect God's glory—even in the midst of a broken and confused generation.

The Apostle Paul urges us in verse 12 to **"work out your salvation with fear and trembling."** This is not a command that restricts our freedom, but a solemn reminder to never forget the weight of grace. As children of God, we can no longer live according to our own desires. Even when doing the same work or speaking the same words, Christians are called to live distinct, set-apart lives. This is because we are meant to be the light of Christ in the world. Only then will our lives truly bless others and shine as lights in darkness.

The church serves as the conscience of the world. While the world is marked by division and competition, the church must exemplify love and peace. Just as the Lord reconciled God and humanity through the cross, believers are called to be united in Christ.

Believers carry the honorable identity of being children of Jesus. Yet, this identity carries with it responsibility alongside freedom. We cannot live as we please. Not only within the church, but also in our families, workplaces, and communities, we must live as people transformed by Christ. Otherwise, we risk becoming those who obscure the gospel rather than proclaim it.

(Ephesians 5:3-4) **"But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people. Nor should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving."**
