Man's Plans an LORD's Purpose | Proverbs 19:21

1. Welcome

2. Sermon Summary

Everyone makes plans in life—plans for the new year, career goals, business, and the future. Yet many of us have also experienced the disappointment of seeing our plans fall apart. Today's passage contrasts **our plans** with **the Lord's purpose**, asking us an important question:

What am I truly trusting in?

① Our hearts are full of many plans.

There is nothing wrong with making plans. In fact, careful planning is often wise and beneficial. However, the phrase "**many plans**" reveals our tendency toward anxiety, impatience, and the desire to stay in control. Too often, we make our plans without inviting God into them.

② Only the Lord's purpose will stand.

This does not mean that our plans are meaningless. Rather, it reminds us that God's sovereign will ultimately prevails. Throughout Scripture, we see countless examples of God accomplishing His greater purposes beyond human plans. His purposes are always faithful, and in the end, they lead to what is good.

③ God must be at the center of all our plans.

God is not asking us to stop planning. Instead, He invites us to commit all our plans to Him. As Scripture says, "**Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and He will establish your plans.**" To do this, we need wisdom from God's Word, prayer before making decisions, a willingness to follow His leading, and trust in whatever outcome He allows.

Even when our plans do not work out, we do not have to lose heart, because God's greater and better purpose is always with us. Beginning today, let us write these words at the top of every plan we make: "**If it is the Lord's will.**" Before making any plan, may we first seek His will and faithfully follow His leading.

3. Discussion

- 1) From this week's Grace Time passage, **Proverbs 19:21, "Human Plans and the Lord's Purpose,"** what spoke to you the most? Why?
- 2) Looking back, have you tended to rely more on **your own plans** or **God's will**? Can you share a recent time when your plans did not work out? How did you see God working through that situation?
- 3) This what is **one area of your life** in which you want to first ask God, "**If it is Your will,**" before making your plans?
(Examples: career, work, finances, family, health, relationships, ministry, or how you use your time.)

After the discussion, let's spend time in united prayer.
