2nd Week of May: Successfully Raising the Next Generation (Genesis 22:1-14)

■ Welcome

■ Text: Genesis 22:1-14

■ Introduction

Today's message looks at the relationship between Abraham and Isaac, showing us the kind of man Abraham was and how he successfully educated his son. May this story inspire you to raise your children well so that they are pleasing to God, and may it teach you lessons about successfully raising children to build the next generation. Abraham obeys God's command to take his precious son, whom he had borne at the age of 100, to Mount Moriah and offer him as a burnt offering.

(v. 1) “The LORD said to Abraham, “Take your son, your son Isaac, your only son, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah and offer him there for a burnt offering on the one mountain of which I have told you.”

Isaac did as his father told him, carrying the wood for the burnt offering on his back. He and Abraham built the altar and spread the wood, and Isaac remained silent and obedient until his father tied him up, placed him on the altar or on the ground, and took a knife to kill him. How could Isaac be so obedient? Isaac obeyed because he believed his father and trusted God and his father. Isaac was able to trust and obey his father in this situation because Abraham had educated him well. Abraham was successful in educating his children. It was also possible because Isaac accepted his father's command with joy.

■ Sharing Question: What kind of person was Abraham so that he could successfully educate his son Isaac?

Answer 1. Who realized that their children are children of God



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Educating children begins with a clear recognition that they are God's children, not mine. In the scene where Abraham takes his 100-year-old son Isaac to Mount Moriah to offer him as a burnt offering, we see that Abraham was deeply aware that this child was God's child, even though God had given him the child.

(vv. 9-10) **“And Abraham came to the place of which God had told him: and he built an altar there, and spread the wood, and bound Isaac his son, and laid him on the wood of the altar, 10 and stretched forth his hand, and took the knife, that he might seize him.”**

Abraham's obedience to God's command, and his offering of his son without a second thought, is based on a clear sense of ownership over his child. Therefore, it is important to make a clear distinction between “my child” and “God's child” in the education of children.

An important principle in this walk of faith is stewardship. We need to recognize that the resources, time, and children entrusted to us by God are not ours, but God's. If you have this awareness, you will be able to bear amazing fruit in your faith.

On the other hand, there are parents who completely disown their children because of a false sense of possessiveness. Why does this happen? Because they think that the children God has given them are mine and they want to educate them in my way. People think that having a prestigious school, a professional career, honor, and wealth will bring happiness, but that's not all. True success in raising children comes when I realize that my children do not belong to me, but to God.

Answer 2. The man who took his child up Mount Moriah

(v. 2) The LORD said, “Take your son, your son Isaac, your son whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and offer him there on the mountain as far as I direct you.”

Abraham takes his son and goes up to Mount Moriah, the mountain of God's promise, the place where the Jerusalem temple will be built, and the temple church. Abraham takes Isaac to offer burnt offerings, or worship, before God. Isaac, like his father, later builds an altar and worships in the same way.

(v. 7) **“And Isaac said unto Abraham his father, my father: and he said unto him, my son, here am I. And Isaac said unto him, Fire and wood are here: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?”**

Isaac asks “where is the lamb” because he has experience offering burnt offerings with his father. Where you take your children matters. If parents don't bring their children to church, they can't come to church. Just as Abraham took Isaac to Mount Moriah, it is



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very important for parents to give their children a proper faith education. It must also be interfered with and enforced. Just as a field of grass will grow weeds if left unattended, a child can fail in faith if left unattended. If you guide your children on the right path of worship, they will practice their faith correctly and become beautiful worshipers before God.

Answer 3. Modeling obedience to God's Word in front of your children.

(v. 3) **“And Abraham rose up early in the morning, and saddled his ass, and took his two servants, and his son Isaac, and split wood for burnt offerings, and departed, and went to the place where God had told him to go.”**

Abraham was a man who modeled obedience to God's Word before his children. Abraham was a man of obedience, and Isaac grew up watching his father obey. Children learn by watching how their parents live their faith. Isaac watched his father obey and became a natural obedient person.

Life education is important. Living education is education that your children see with their eyes, hear with their ears, and experience with their hearts. The faithfulness of parents is the most important teaching because children see and learn how parents live their faith. How you live your faith is how your children will live theirs. When parents are consistent in their faith, their children learn about the right God.

*** To help your children grow up in the right faith by your example, see**

First, pray specifically for your children. Second, lead them to church. Third, have home worship services, Fourth, do not do anything that is not an example to your children

When parents practice their faith in God properly, their children will grow closer to God and, by the grace of God, will be made disciples who will take the gospel to the ends of the earth.
