### 4th Week of September: Let's Return to the Bible 2 (John 1:1-4, 14)

#### ■ Welcome

Let's share our favorite Bible verse, Bible character, or an episode related to the Bible. Also, share how God touched you through Grace Time this week.

#### ■ Text: John 1:1-5, 14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of men..... 14 The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We saw his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

#### ■ Introduction

The Bible is Jesus Christ, the very Word of God. In the sermon on the last Sunday of August, we explored together who Jesus is as the Word.

##### 1. Jesus is the Word who is God.

He is not a created being, but the eternal Son of God who existed from eternity past, one with the Triune God.

##### 2. Jesus is the Word who is the Creator.

All things were created through Him, and they exist and are sustained in Him.

##### 3. Jesus is the Word who is Life.

He is the One who gives eternal life to us who were in sin and death, enabling us to live abundant life.

John 1:14 states that Jesus, the Word, came to this earth in human flesh. This is called the Incarnation. Today, we seek to understand why Jesus, the Word, came in human flesh—that is, the reason for His Incarnation and its significance.

#### ■ Observation Question: What does it mean that Jesus came in the flesh?

**Answer 1. Jesus is the Word who became flesh and became a man.**



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The “flesh” (sarx) refers to the human body, the fragile human nature. The eternal Word of God took on human form and came into the world. The Incarnation is God’s self-emptying (kenosis). This event is a mystery beyond human reason to fully comprehend.

(Phil 2:6-8) “Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross.”

**\* Why did the only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, come in human flesh?**

**1) To reveal the invisible God.**

(John 1:18) “No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father’s side, has made him known.”

**2) To become the sacrifice for atonement.**

(John 1:36b) “...Behold, the Lamb of God!”

(Ephesians 1:7) “In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God’s grace.”

**3) To sympathize with our weaknesses.**

(Hebrews 4:15) “For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet without sin.”

### Application Question 1

1. Just as Jesus revealed the invisible God, how can I show God to the people around me?

### Answer 2. Jesus is the Word full of grace and truth.

Grace is God’s gift bestowed upon those who do not deserve it. Truth is the genuine reality without falsehood, the right standard by which humans should live. The law reveals sin, but grace and truth resolve sin. **That grace and truth** are full in Jesus Christ means they overflow and flow to believers. Jesus’ public ministry is evidence of this fullness. **Example: Public Ministry: Preaching, Healing, Teaching**

The Lord proclaimed the gospel of the kingdom, healed the sick, and cast out demons. He forgave hopeless sinners, called disciples, loved them to the end, and established them as God’s people.

Today, the risen Lord remains with us through His Word and works through the Holy Spirit. When the Word is proclaimed, the sick are healed, sinners are forgiven, eternal life is declared, and dead souls come alive. The Word works miracles and enables us to experience God’s love and glory. Thus, believers are trained and established by the Word to become God’s people.



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**Example: The Bible of President Lincoln, with a clear fingerprint mark on this verse**

**(Psalm 34:4) “I sought the Lord, and He answered me and delivered me from all my fears.”**

Lincoln clung to this word, finding courage and hope even amid the Civil War and countless trials. Likewise, when we hold fast to the Word, we are filled with grace and truth.

### Application Question 2

1. How consistently am I reading and meditating on God’s Word, using it as the standard for my life? (Reading, memorization, thorough reading, Bible study, meditation, etc.)

2. What promise from God should I hold onto in the problem I’m facing right now?

Example: Like Lincoln, choose one promise from Scripture that fits your situation, write it down in your notebook, and hold onto that word in prayer for a week, seeking courage and hope.

### Answer 3. Jesus is the Word who completed the work of salvation.

Jesus’ final words on the cross, the Greek “tetelestai,” are in the perfect tense, meaning “It is finished” (John 19:30). These words proclaim that the work of salvation has already been completed. The Old Testament law and sacrifices were shadows and types, and now on the cross, all those shadows have been fulfilled in reality.

**(Hebrews 10:12) “But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God.”**

Furthermore, Jesus is the Word who came in flesh like us, the Word full of grace and truth, and the Word who accomplished the final completion. By the Word, the heavens and earth began; by the Word, salvation was accomplished; and by the Word, the work will be completed.

Therefore, **returning to the Scriptures is returning to Jesus, who is the Word, and walking with Him.** True power and hope in our lives reside only in the Word. When we draw near to the Word, obey the Word, and live with the Word, we will enjoy life in the Lord, be filled with grace and truth, and participate in the final glorious completion. Return to the Scriptures. Walk with the Word. That path is the very way of salvation where Jesus walks with us, and the path leading to glory.

### Application Question 3

1. How are you utilizing the 1000-fold Offering dawn worship messages or devotionals to cultivate the habit of starting and ending your day with God’s Word? (Whether personally, within your household, or in your home church)
