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## Family church worship plan 2025. 7. 27

### 4th Week of July: Caring for One Another Brings Joy to the Lord (Philippians 2:4)

#### ■ Welcome

Let us share the joy we received (unexpectedly or unexpectedly) and the joy of serving. Also, share one of the things you were graced with during Grace Time last week.

#### ■ Text: : Philippians 2:4

4 Not only should each of you look out for your own interests, but also for the interests of others, so that my joy may be complete.

#### ■ Introduction

GMI Grace Church confesses that it began through the care and concern of the mother church from the very beginning. It was also established through the dedication of many believers and churches who not only looked after their own affairs but also looked after the affairs of others, thereby filling God with joy.

The many churches that provided financial support and donated their talents for GMI Grace Church are the very ones who “looked not only to their own affairs but also to the affairs of others, thereby fulfilling God's joy,” as it is said.

For example, during the two months it took to remodel the worship space, GMI Grace Church needed a place to use. At that time, God provided a worship space that had already been prepared, allowing them to use all the facilities there for two months to hold worship services. This was made possible by the “Giving Church,” which freely offered love (care) without charge.

GMI Grace Church was also given the opportunity to repay the love they had received. By allowing a worship community in need of a place of worship to use the main sanctuary free of charge once a month, they practiced the love of “caring for one another.” Through this, the worship community was also joyful, but the Lord must have been even more joyful to see GMI Grace Church fulfilling the needs of another community. Today, we will explore how we can bring joy to God through “caring for others, caring for one another.”

■ Observation Question: If caring for others brings joy to God, what should we do to put this into practice?



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### Answer 1. We must care about our neighbors and look after them.

The meaning of the phrase “**look back**” in verse 4 is “to look carefully” or “to examine with interest.” The meaning of this word is not simply to fulfill the needs of those who come to us asking for help. Rather, it means to examine others with interest in order to discover their needs.

Why is this done? It is to discover their needs and fulfill them with love as if they were our own. Ultimately, it is to convey the grace and love of the cross that we have received from the Lord to them.

The greatest model in human history for caring for others is our Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus knew that He had to endure the painful death on the cross to resolve the problem of sin in humanity. Nevertheless, Jesus shared the same mind and will as the Father God and was fully united with Him.

(Philippians 2:6-8) “**Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. 8 And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.**”

In this way, Jesus tells us to live a life in which we not only look after our own affairs but also look after the affairs of others. Therefore, Jesus has brought us together with our brothers and sisters in the church, shown us the souls who are dying without knowing Him, and connected us with missionaries who are ministering in difficult circumstances. It is the Lord’s will and what pleases Him for us to take an interest in them, look after them, discern their needs, and extend a helping hand to them first.

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### Answer 2. We must have the mind of Jesus Christ.

(Philippians 2:5) “**Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus.**”

In the original language of the Bible, “**Let this mind be in you**” is written in the passive voice as “Let this mind become in you.” This means, “I will breathe this mind into you. Therefore, accept the mind that I breathe into you.” It does not mean that He will breathe it into you once or twice. It means that He will continue to breathe the mind of Jesus into you every day, every moment. It means that He will continue to breathe the mind of Jesus into believers who have true faith.

When I accept the mind of Jesus, who is the ultimate model of caring for others, the fruit of caring for others will appear in my life.

However, caring for others is not easy. At times, it can be inconvenient for me. Caring for others typically involves sharing what I have, giving my time, and making an effort. It may even lead to the inconvenience of giving up a room in my house and living communally. At times, I may have to humble myself, and it may even put me in danger. And like Jesus, I may have to die. But when such an attitude toward life becomes the life of a true believer, the Lord is pleased.

#### \* The Parable of the Sheep and the Goats (Matthew 25:32-46)

At the end of time, the Lord will divide all nations into two groups. He will say the following to the righteous who stand on the side of the sheep and those who stand on the side of the goats.

To the righteous, He will say, “**Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me**” (verse 40), and to those on the goats’ side, He will say, “**Whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me**” (verse 45).

(Verse 46) “**Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life.**”

May you receive the heart of Jesus that the Lord gives, and may your life be filled with the joy of God as you look after the needs of others, in the name of Jesus.

#### ✿ Application Question 2
