Second Week of March:

Turn Family into Church and Transform the World (Romans 16:3-4)

■ Welcome

How do you want your family top be used for God's kingdom? Please share how God touched your heart through Grace Time this week.

■ Text: Romans 16:3-4

3 Greet Priscilla[a] and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus. 4 They risked their lives for me. Not only I but all the churches of the Gentiles are grateful to them.

■ Introduction

We often think that great works of God can only be done by special clergy or heroic figures. However, when we move from the Old Testament stories of Caleb and David into the New Testament, we see how ordinary believers filled with the gospel conquered and influenced the world for the kingdom of God. A representative example is the couple Priscilla and Aquila.

They were not official pastors or prophets. They were ordinary people like us who had a regular job (tentmaking). Yet God did not use them because of their social status or background, but because their lives were filled with the gospel.

Even in the hardship of being expelled from Rome, they offered their lives and circumstances for the sake of the gospel and became unforgettable figures in the early church.

Through the lives of this couple, we want to see what true fullness in the New Testament means. How did these ordinary people, who were not ministers, become leaders who transformed the world where God placed them?

The answer is not environment or social status. The answer is a life filled with the gospel.

Now let us share together how our homes can become churches that transform the world.

■ Observation Question: How did Priscilla and Aquila become the most influential family church in the early Christian community?

Answer 1. They assisted Apostle Paul and served as co-workers in his missionary ministry.

(Romans 16:3-4) “Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus. They risked their lives for me. Not only I but all the churches of the Gentiles are grateful to them.”

Priscilla and Aquila met the Apostle Paul in Corinth while working as tentmakers. What began as a partnership for making a living soon grew into a partnership in Godly mission. In Romans 16:3-4, Paul testifies, “Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my co-workers in Christ Jesus. They risked their very lives for me,” expressing his deep gratitude for their devotion.

Although they were not apostles who preached publicly, they wholeheartedly served behind the scenes so that Paul could focus on his ministry, and through this they shared in the reward of the apostolic work. Like a key supporting actor who makes the main character shine in a movie, their service was a powerful act of conquering and governing the world from the perspective of God’s kingdom. Just as Elder Oh Yoon-sun in Korean church history became a shield for Pastor Joo Ki-cheol, this couple was the strongest supporter—quietly and faithfully upholding the pastor without seeking recognition.

✿ Application Question 1

1) Just as how Priscilla and Acquila served apostle Paul, what inconvenience or sacrifice am I willing to bear for the community or leader I serve?

Answer 2. They shared the complete gospel to Apollos and helped to establish him as a minister.

(Acts 18:24-28)

24 Now a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria, came to Ephesus. He was a learned man with a thorough knowledge of the Scriptures. **25** He had been instructed in the way of the Lord, and he spoke with great fervor and taught about Jesus accurately, though he knew only the baptism of John. **26** He began to speak boldly in the synagogue. When Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately. **27** When Apollos wanted to go to Achaia, the brothers and sisters encouraged him and wrote to the disciples there to welcome him. When he arrived, he was a great help to those who by grace had believed. **28** For he vigorously refuted the Jews in public debate, proving from the Scriptures that Jesus is the Christ.

God used Priscilla and Aquila not only to assist Apostle Paul, but also to raise up Apollos, who would become a great servant for the early church. According to Acts 18:24-28, Apollos was an educated man and knowledgeable in the Scriptures, but he knew only the baptism of John.

Priscilla and Acquila took him aside and explained the way of God more accurately. They did not rebuke him publicly. Instead, they humbly brought him aside and taught him, helping him grow into a powerful minister who would lead many Jews to the Lord.

Even in the conversions of well-known Christian figures such as Charles Spurgeon and John Wesley, there were unknown ordinary believers whose simple yet sincere witness of the gospel and peaceful faith influenced them. The humble and loving lives of ordinary believers can sometimes become a “silent sermon” that touches people’s hearts even more powerfully than a sermon from the pulpit.

✿ Application Question 2

1) Have you ever experienced a moment when your attitude in life—such as gentleness, sacrifice, or love—became a “silent sermon” that positively influenced someone else? Please share.

Answer 3. Wherever they went, they offered their home as a church and served leaders.

(Romans 16:5)

“Greet also the church that meets at their house. Greet my dear friend Epäenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in the province of Asia.”

Wherever they went—whether in Ephesus or Rome—they offered their home as a place for the church to gather. In Romans 16:5, Paul writes, “Greet also the church that meets at their house.” This refers not to a building, but to the community of believers who gathered in this couple’s home.

Opening one’s home as a church requires real sacrifice—giving up personal privacy, preparing food for others, and offering one’s time and living space for the sake of the gospel. Even though they did not hold apostolic offices or possess extraordinary gifts, they dedicated their home, possessions, and living space as much as possible for the kingdom of God.

Even today, God’s kingdom continues to expand through families in our church who have faithfully opened their homes for decades, quietly serving believers as leaders of house churches.

✿ Application Question 3

1) What is one small thing we can practice this week so that our home can become more than just a place of rest, but a channel that gives life to people and builds up the next generation?
