3rd Week of July: A man with God's presence (Genesis 39:1-6)

Welcome

Text: Genesis 39:1-6

1 Now Joseph had been taken down to Egypt. Potiphar, an Egyptian who was one of Pharaoh's officials, the captain of the guard, bought him from the Ishmaelites who had taken him there.2 The LORD was with Joseph so that he prospered, and he lived in the house of his Egyptian master. 3 When his master saw that the LORD was with him and that the LORD gave him success in everything he did, 4 Joseph found favor in his eyes and became his attendant. Potiphar put him in charge of his household, and he entrusted to his care everything he owned. 5 From the time he put him in charge of his household and of all that he owned, the LORD blessed the household of the Egyptian because of Joseph. The blessing of the LORD was on everything Potiphar had, both in the house and in the field. 6 So Potiphar left everything he had in Joseph's care; with Joseph in charge, he did not concern himself with anything except the food he ate. Now Joseph was well-built and handsome,

Introduction

It is very important who you are with in the world. This is because what kind of people you associate with has a great impact not only on the physical aspect but also on the spiritual aspect.

Moses grew up as a prince of Egypt, but when he was with people who did not know God, he could only become a murderer and a fugitive. However, when he experienced God's grace and began to walk closely with God, he was used as a great leader.

(Exodus 33:11) **The LORD would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend.** Then Moses would return to the camp, but his young aide Joshua son of Nun did not leave the tent. Joshua, who was called "Joshua the servant of Moses," was always by Moses' side, learning from how Moses prayed, preached the word, and communicated with God. Finally, he succeeded Moses' work and accomplished the great mission of conquering Canaan.

Joseph, a young man with a lot of dreams, grew up with the special love of his father, Jacob, but he was sold into slavery in Egypt because of the envy and hatred of his brothers. Later, he was falsely accused and imprisoned. In the eyes of the world, it was a completely ruined life. However, the Bible refers to him as "a prosperous man" (verses 2~3).

The prosperity that the world speaks of is the state in which my will is fulfilled, but the prosperity that the Bible speaks of is the state in which God's will is fulfilled in my life. The true



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blessing is not to walk the path we want, but to walk the path God wants. Prosperity is not a life without suffering, but a life that fulfills God's will in the midst of suffering.

■ **Sharing Question: How can a believer walk with God like Joseph?**

Answer 1. Be a longing for God's grace.

A life of walking with God is not completed all at once. It is a spiritual journey that is refined in suffering, broken, and transformed into a constitution that longs for grace.

Joseph's life is a vivid example of this. In the envy and hatred of his brothers, he suffered from the tearing and peeling of his colored clothes, and finally he was sold as a slave in Egypt, a strange land. He was cast alone into a foreign land. In addition, in the desperate situation of being falsely accused and imprisoned, God was the only refuge for him. The Bible does not directly say that Joseph cried out to God. However, the fruits of his life show that he lived by seeking God's grace.

The same is true of Jacob, who lived by his own scheme all his life. When he heard that his brother Esau was coming with 400 soldiers, he was left alone by the Jabbok River, trembling with fear, and for the first time he wrestled and cried out all night with all his heart. "God, I can't let go of it without blessing you." He suffered a broken thresher bone while praying, and he was completely broken. Only then did Jacob change into a man of grace. His will was destroyed, and he relied only on God.

Psalms 42 says: "As a deer thirsts for a stream, so my soul thirsts for you." Those who have received grace cannot live without grace. This time is chaotic and dark, and the world is in fear and despair. However, those who have received grace are not swept away, but draw closer to God.

❁ Application Question 1

- 1) If you have a difficult experience in your life when you were thrown into a pool of life because of someone else's slander, let's share it.
- 2) What should I decide to do to experience the grace of Jabbok River like Jacob?

Answer 2. Learn to rely on God (verse 2).

In verse 2, Joseph became a prosperous man because "the Lord was with him." Joseph was a man who thoroughly realized that he could not do anything on his own. God will surely give grace to those who rely on Him. Joseph relied on the Lord moment by moment and followed the Lord's wisdom and guidance. So his life was prosperous. Paul was also an apostle who suffered a lot. However, he experienced that if he relied on the Lord, He would fill him and guide him.

(Philippians 4:11-12) **I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. 12 I know what it is to be in need, and I know**



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what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want.

Jesus also relied on God the Father every day. In order to live according to the will of the Father, not His own, He always prostrated himself in prayer, following His habits. (Jeremiah 17:7-8) **"But blessed is the one who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him. 8 They will be like a tree planted by the water that sends out its roots by the stream. It does not fear when heat comes; its leaves are always green. It has no worries in a year of drought and never fails to bear fruit."**

Those who rely on God will not be shaken by any circumstances, and their lives will surely prosper.

❁ Application Question 2

- 1) Let's share what God has trained us to live a life of dependence on God (a life of words, prayers, thanksgiving, and praise).
- 2) What do I want to learn to rely on God in particular?

Answer 3. Submit to God's word beyond obedience.

Through suffering, Joseph realized that he could not live without God's grace and became a God-fearing man. So, when Potiphar's wife tempted him, he was able to overcome sin because he feared God, saying, **"How can I do this great evil and sin against God?"** (39:9).

Obedience is to do only what you can, and obedience is to do what you don't want to do. Joseph became a prosperous man because he chose to obey. We must also go to the point of obeying God's word. God delights in total obedience. When there is obedience, prosperity follows.

Jesus' bearing the cross is an example of obedience. He wanted to avoid death on the cross, but He obeyed, saying, **"My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me, but not my will, but yours be done"** (Matt. 26:39).

(Philippians 2:8) **"He has appeared in the form of a man, but he lowers himself and obeys himself to death. You're dead on the cross soon."**

God's history is above the life of obedience. The life of faith responds with "Amen" and obeys the Word. But even obedience is often difficult. That is why obedience is necessary.
