Third Week of May: The Love God Remembers (Proverbs 31:10-31)

■ Welcome

What is one vivid memory you have of your mother (or someone who raised and cared for you)? Let's also share one thing you received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Proverbs 31:10-31

■ Introduction

Today is Mother's Day Sunday. A mother is often the one who stays awake so her family could sleep peacefully. She endured hardship quietly so that her family could smile. She held her children with tears and prayer so they would not fall. Especially in the lives of immigrants, many mothers did not give up on their families despite living in unfamiliar places and facing lonely realities. Even in environments where they struggled with language and culture, they worked tirelessly for their children and placed their family's future above their own dreams. Yet people—especially children—do not always remember those sacrifices. But God remembers. Even when no one else notices, God sees every unseen act of love and devotion.

Today, through the example of the virtuous woman in Proverbs 31, we will reflect together on the kind of love that God remembers and delights in. "An excellent wife who can find? She is far more precious than jewels."

(Proverbs 31:10) "Ultimately, this love points us to the sacrificial love of Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us on the cross."

■ Observation Question: What kind of love does God remember and delight in?

Answer 1. The Love God Remembers Is a Love That Builds Others Up.

(Proverbs 14:1) "The wise woman builds her house, but with her own hands the foolish one tears hers down."

A virtuous woman is not someone who tears people down, but someone who builds them up. A wise person chooses words and actions that bring life rather than reacting only according to emotions.



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1) She Builds Up Her Husband

(v.12) “She brings him good, not harm, all the days of her life.”

A virtuous woman strengthens her husband. She encourages him with her words: “Because of you, our family has come this far.” She also prays faithfully in unseen places. Others may not notice, but God remembers.

(v.11) “The heart of her husband trusts in her…”

A husband who is supported in this way gains renewed strength, and with that strength, he continues to lead and protect his family.

2) She Builds Up Her Children

“Her children arise and call her blessed…” (v.28) A virtuous woman builds up her children with love. Yet many mothers live with feelings of inadequacy, regret, and guilt. But God values love more than perfection.

***Nick Vujicic’s mother once encouraged him with these words:**

“God does not make mistakes.”, “You are a child within God’s plan.” Those words became a source of strength that shaped his life.

✿ Application Question 1

- 1) Has there been someone in your life who built you up through a single word of encouragement? Share that experience if it still remains meaningful to you.
- 2) Do you tend to speak words that build others up—family members, friends, or church members—or do you sometimes unknowingly tear others down? Share a recent example

Answer 2. The Love God Remembers Is a Love That Faithfully Embraces the Family

(V. 27) “She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness.” The phrase “watches over” carries the meaning of staying alert and faithfully guarding.

1) She Provides for Her Family

“She is like the merchant ships, bringing her food from afar. She rises while it is yet night” (v.14-15)

A virtuous woman does not ignore the needs of her family. Even when weary, she rises again to care for them.

2) She Warmly Cares for the Life of Her Family

(v.13) “She selects wool and flax and works with eager hands.” She did more than simply manage household tasks; she embraced her family with warmth and care. Love is often revealed through small and faithful acts of service.

3) She Sacrificially Serves Her Family

(v.18) “Her lamp does not go out at night.”

Even when no one sees her efforts, she continues to serve faithfully. God remembers quiet devotion.

✿ Application Question 2



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1) In what way does the statement, “God values love more than perfection,” bring comfort to you? Share any feelings of inadequacy you may experience as a parent or caregiver.

2) Is there a relationship or responsibility you feel tempted to give up on? What do you think is needed to continue embracing that role faithfully?

Answer 3. The Love God Remembers Is a Love That Flows to Others .

(V. 20) “She opens her arms to the poor and extends her hands to the needy.”

A virtuous woman cares not only for her own family, but also for those around her who are hurting. She reaches out to those in need and allows love to flow beyond the walls of her home. God delights in this kind of love. “Give generously to them…” (Deuteronomy 15:10)

A virtuous woman is not satisfied with caring only for herself. She shares the grace she has received with others. She serves the church, prays for the weak, and does not ignore those who need help. This is the wisdom that God honors. In 2 Kings 4, the Shunammite woman welcomed Elisha whenever he passed by. She prepared food for him and even made a small room with a bed, table, chair, and lamp so he could rest. She gladly shared her time and resources, and through her hospitality, the community was blessed.

✿ Application Question 3

1) The Shunammite woman prepared only a small room, yet her simple act of service became deeply meaningful. Have you experienced a small act of kindness—either given or received—that made a significant impact?

Answer 4. The Love God Remembers Ultimately Bears Fruit

(Proverbs 31:29-31) “Many women do noble things, but you surpass them all… Charm is deceptive, and beauty is fleeting; but a woman who fears the Lord is to be praised.” The life of a virtuous woman ultimately bears fruit. At home, she receives the respect of her husband and children; in the community, she gains the trust of others.

Yet this praise does not come from seeking recognition. It is the fruit of a life faithfully lived in love. Early morning prayers, patient tears, unseen sacrifices, and quiet devotion for the family eventually bear lasting fruit in God’s time. God never forgets acts of love and faithfulness.

✿ Application Question 4

1) The praise of the virtuous woman was not gained through self-promotion, but through a life of quiet faithfulness. Is there something in your life that you believe God is calling you to continue doing, even if it is not immediately recognized by others?
