## Family church worship plan 2026. 3. 15

**3rd week of March: Those who remain to the end change the world. (2 Timothy 4:9-11)**

### ■ Welcome

If you have a friend, co-worker, or colleague that you will never forget, let's share it. Please share how God touched your heart through Grace Time this week.

### ■ Text: : 2 Timothy 4:9~11

9 Do your best to come to me quickly, 10 for Demas, because he loved this world, has deserted me and has gone to Thessalonica. Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus to Dalmatia. 11 Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, because he is helpful to me in my ministry.

### ■ Introduction

We are now looking at the people who have achieved the kingdom of God in their respective places of life according to God's command to **“be full, conquer, and rule.”**

In the Bible, there are characters who have been used by God in various places in life. There was Daniel, who served in the royal palace, and Nehemiah, who was a civil servant. There were also lay people like Priscilla and Aquila, who made tents. God accomplished the work of the kingdom of God through each person's occupation and environment.

Luke, who we will share today, was a layman who had a professional profession as a doctor. He used his expertise for gospel ministry rather than for worldly success. He was a faithful co-worker who accompanied the Apostle Paul on his missionary journey, taking care of his health and helping in the ministry. Later, Luke wrote the Gospel of Luke and the book of Acts to pass on the work of Jesus Christ and the missionary history of the early church to future generations.

Now, through the life of Luke, who was a lay professional minister, we would like to examine God's work and discover the principles of fill, conquer, and rule that appear in it.

**■ Observation Question: How did Luke remain Paul's lay co-worker to the end and accomplish the work of changing the world?**

### Answer 1. He was a man filled with the Holy Spirit and the love of his soul.

Lukas means “to shine,” “to illuminate,” and “to shine light” in Greek. As the name suggests, God has made the light of the gospel shine through him to the world. He was not an apostle who was prominently revealed to the people, but he was quietly but deeply used in the history of the kingdom of God.

The most important force that moved Luke’s life was the ‘work of the Holy Spirit’. He accompanied Paul in the gospel ministry and saw up close the scene of the Holy Spirit changing people’s lives. When the gospel was preached, people’s hearts were changed, and I saw that souls who were in despair met God and started a new life. He witnessed firsthand the amazing work of the Holy Spirit moving people’s hearts and changing the direction of their lives.

Also, as a doctor, he was a person who saw human illness and suffering more closely than anyone else. He must have deeply realized that no matter how much a person’s body is healed, there is a limit in the end, but a soul that has left God cannot be saved without the gospel.

(Matthew 16:26) “If a man gains all the world and loses his life, what good will it be?”

As a result, the reason why Jesus came to this earth, ‘love for lost souls’, naturally began to settle in his heart.

(Luke 19:10) “The Son of man came to seek and save the lost.”

He accompanied Paul in the gospel ministry and used his life and talents to save souls. Luke was ‘a man full of the Holy Spirit and the love of the soul.’

### Answer 2. He was a man who conquered his own stability and success.

Luke was a doctor and had a very respected profession at the time. As a result, he was able to enjoy a socially stable life. However, he chose the path of missions instead of a comfortable life, and the path of hardship instead of stability.

Wherever Paul preached the gospel, there was always danger and persecution, prisons, and threats to life. Nevertheless, Luke did not depart from the path he was on with Paul. When Paul was imprisoned for the last time, many people left him, but the Bible records, “**Luke alone is with me.**” Why did he do that? This is because he saw the eternal value that was invisible rather than what he see.

(2 Corinthians 4:17-18) “The lightness of our temporary tribulation causes us to accomplish the great of the greatest and everlasting glory: what we look back on is not visible, but what is not seen, what is seen is temporary, and what is not seen is eternal.”

Luke saw the life of the apostle Paul, who lived with this truth, closely. At first, he may have accompanied Paul as his personal physician. But in the end, he would have realized that living for the gospel was the most valuable life. Therefore, he willingly walked the path of suffering with Paul.

### Answer 3. He was a man who expanded the kingdom of God through records and co-workers.

Luke first worked as a physician to take care of the health of Paul and his co-workers. However, as time passed, God allowed Luke to use another gift. It is the ‘gift of records’.

Luke traveled with the apostle Paul, experienced the work of the Holy Spirit, and met many witnesses of the gospel. At that time, he thought to himself, “**These testimonies must be recorded.**” A clear mission begins to take hold.

He was a doctor who was well aware of the importance of records, so he began to record the work of God in detail. Based on these records, two Bibles were written, namely **the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts.**

Another important feature of Luke’s ministry is ‘**co-working**’. He was a co-worker who faithfully helped Paul in his ministry in the position entrusted to him and stayed by Paul’s side until the end (verse 11).

People often place more importance on roles like Paul’s. But Luke faithfully carried out his mission in an invisible place. In the end, God made him write the Gospel of Luke and the book of Acts, making him a great witness to the gospel that influenced the entire history of the church.
