1st Week of June: Already and Not Yet (Galatians 5:16-20)

### Welcome

■ Text: Galatians 5:16-20

### Introduction

Since we have been saved and become children of God, the Bible teaches that while some things have already been fulfilled, others are yet to be completed. The Apostle Paul speaks about these unfinished areas and how we ought to continue transforming ourselves. In doing so, he presents a list of fifteen sins that are considered works of the flesh

(5:19~21) 19 The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; 20 idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions 21 and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God.

Furthermore, it is said that if one continues to follow the desires of the flesh, they will not inherit the kingdom of God. God desires for His children to enjoy many blessings on this earth. Therefore, while He warns us against the desires of the flesh, He also speaks about the fruit of the Spirit.

The Apostle Paul encourages us not to pursue the works of the flesh, but to live as people who bear the fruit of the Spirit.

(5:22~23) 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law.

■ Sharing Question: How can we live as people who bear the fruit of the Spirit?

Answer 1. You must be led by the Holy Spirit.





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(5:16) So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

The Apostle Paul presents a list of fifteen sins that stem from the desires of the flesh and urges us to follow the Spirit in order to avoid such works of the flesh.

To 'follow the Spirit' means to imitate the Spirit in action or to live in harmony with the Spirit. It implies a continuous and intentional effort to pursue the Spirit

Even though we strive to become people of the Spirit—through prayer, worship, and equipping ourselves with God's Word—we often fail to live according to the Spirit's will. This is because the desires of the flesh continue to lead and influence us.

(5:17) For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever[a] you want.

The Holy Spirit does not lead us forcefully, because God has given us free will. He desires that we give Him even greater glory by willingly obeying Him through our free will. If we use our freewill to pursue the works of the flesh, we will inevitably live according to the flesh. This displeases and worries the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. However, when we choose to live by the Spirit, we can live a life that fulfills God's will.

(Romans 8:13) For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live.

### **Application Question 1**

- 1) What were the desires of the flesh or fruit of Spirit that dictated your life this week?
- 2) What decisions did you make to follow the Holy Spirit?

### Answer 2. We must deny ourselves and take up the cross.

(5:24) Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires,

Human nature is self-centered. We have a propensity to pursue our own desires and intentions, which leads us to seek prosperity and comfort rather than to carry the cross.

(1John 2:16) For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—comes not from the Father but from the world.

Therefore, Christians must crucify desires of their flesh in their everyday lives. This guidance by the Holy Spirit does not happen automatically but is accomplished through daily obedience.

Pastor Kim continues to challenge and teach us through his ministry. After waking up from anesthesia following colon cancer surgery, he reportedly said, "Ah! Why are we here? We should be at the mission field"



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Because he understood that the narrow path is God's grace, blessing, and work, he earnestly strove to choose that path and lived a life of obedience until the end.

(Luke 9:23) Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.

### Application Question 2

- 1) What is the biggest challenge in your life that prevents you from bearing the fruit of the Spirit?
- 2) Please share the joy and grace that God grants when you deny yourself and take up your cross.

### Answer 3. Do not become conceited.

(5:26) Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

'Vain glory' refers to something empty and worthless, yet it describes an attitude of self-display or the pursuit of honor, such as pride. Our corrupt human nature leads us to seek our own glory rather than God's. Being conceited, provoking others, stirring up envy or anger, and living according to our own will rather than God's all stem from pursuing this vain glory. When people seek vain glory, they become agitated and envious of one another.

- 1) Being agitated with one another means to 'stimulate or provoke'—an attitude of ignoring or challenging others out of competitiveness or pride.
- 2) Being competitive with one another refers to jealousy, envy, and feeling uncomfortable with others' strengths or blessings. When others succeed, we should rather pray for more blessings for them.

As children of God, we should be filled with the Holy Spirit. However, when we pursue the works of the flesh, we continue to live in pursuit of 'vain glory.' Instead, believers are called to bless one another with words of encouragement and life. The Apostle Paul speaks of 15 works of the flesh and 9 fruits of the Spirit, emphasizing that there is a deep conflict within us—but we must choose to live by following the desires of the Spirit

### Application Question 3

- 1) What can we do amongst our cell group to avoid comparing and competing with each other over meaningless things?
- 2) Let us bless and pray for one another so that we do not provoke or envy each other by seeking vain glory.
