3rd week of February: Holding in the hands of the Holy and Let's Become a Church (Nehemiah 1:1~5)

■ Welcome

Let's share the joy of bearing fruit by being together, not alone. Also, let's share one of the gracious things we received through last week's Grace Time.

■ Text: Nehemiah 1:1~5

1 The words of Nehemiah son of Hakaliah: In the month of Kislev in the twentieth year, while I was in the citadel of Susa, 2 Hanani, one of my brothers, came from Judah with some other men, and I questioned them about the Jewish remnant that had survived the exile, and also about Jerusalem. 3 They said to me, "Those who survived the exile and are back in the province are in great trouble and disgrace. The wall of Jerusalem is broken down, and its gates have been burned with fire." 4 When I heard these things, I sat down and wept. For some days I mourned and fasted and prayed before the God of heaven. 5 Then I said: "LORD, the God of heaven, the great and awesome God, who keeps his covenant of love with those who love him and keep his commandments,

■ Introduction

After the return of Israel's captivity, the temple was built, but the walls remained crumbled. The wall is not just a defensive facility, but a boundary that protects God's presence and rule, the identity and order of the people. In the face of this long desolation, God calls Nehemiah not from Jerusalem, but from the Persian Empire's Susan Palace.

Nehemiah was a master of King Artaxerxes, a second-generation prisoner who stood in the heart of the empire. It is not man's ability to get him there. He was held by God's holy hand, and God's good hand was with him. Nehemiah's meaning is "to be comforted by God." He was not the one who was comforted, but the one who allowed God's comfort to flow throughout Jerusalem.

Let us look at how God's words, "Fill, conquer, and rule" became real in a person's life through Nehemiah's life.

■ Observation Question: Why did God choose Nehemiah?

Answer 1. Leadership Prepared with God's Heart - The Man of Male

Before God uses a person, He always prepares him first. God sees how much He can contain God's heart before entrusting him with a task. Therefore, before God wrote Nehemiah, He first filled his heart with the pain of the kingdom of God and the fallen country (verses 3~4). Even though he was a second-generation captive, he was able to cry for his country because God filled his heart with God's heart. **'Be full' means 'the state in which God's heart completely fills a person's heart.'**

His tears were a response based on the Word and the beginning of a prayer to hold on to God's promise that had not yet been fulfilled (verse 5). After about four months of weeping and praying to God, he finally stood before the king.

In 1989, he wailed alone for countless nights and prayed, "Lord, please open the door to missions in the former Soviet Union."

Nehemiah was standing in God's time, not in his own time. Male, "be full" is the stage of preparing a person. God's work begins only through those who are filled with God's heart and God's mission.

Answer 2. Leadership that conquers mission with prayer at every moment - Kabash's man

Nehemiah was neither a priest nor a prophet. However, he was a man who had the heart of God and fought head-to-head with prayer in front of the barrier of reality. He prayed with tears and wailing for four months, waiting for God's timing, and finally received permission from King Artaxerxes. The king appointed him governor of Jerusalem and officially supported the reconstruction of the walls. Looking back on all this, Nehemiah confesses:

(Neh. 2:8) **"The good hand of my God helped me, and the king allowed it."**

Kabash is the spiritual force that pushes the mission to the end in the face of any obstacles. And that power always comes from prayer.

1) Conquer the outside - Prayer to focus on the mission

Despite the severe interference of Sanballat and Tobiah, who interfered with the reconstruction of the wall, Nehemiah did not accept the fight with words, but resisted it with prayer.

(Neh. 4:9) **"When we pray to our God ... They have watchmen to guard day and night."**

2) Conquer the Inside - Restructuring the Community

A spiritual battle that was more serious than external infiltration was internal division.

(Neh. 5:1) **"Then the people cried out with their wives and complained against their brother, the man of Judah."**

He does not cover up the problem and deals with the unjust structure head-on. Kabash is the

power to face painful reality and cut off injustice with heavenly wisdom in prayer. In the end, when God's time came, the reconstruction of the wall, which had been blocking 140 years, was completed in 52 days.

(Neh. 6:15) **"The work of the Holy Church ended on the twenty-second day of the month of Elul in fifty-two days."**

1) Have you ever been able to confess that 'God did it' through crying out prayer in a difficult situation? Please share it.

Answer 3. Leadership that Brings Revival Through God's Reign - The Man of Lada

When the wall was completed, Nehemiah did not stop and sought the work of God's good hand to revive the community. This was because the true purpose of the wall was to restore God's rule among the people and to bring about a spiritual awakening and revival. This is the leadership that actually establishes God's rule (Radha) in life and community.

(Psalm 103:19) **"The Lord has set up his throne in heaven, and he rules over all things by his government."**

Nehemiah was the man who showed God's rule in the midst of the community.

1) Leaders who build up the word

(Neh. 8:1) "All the people gathered together in the square before the sluice gate and asked Ezra the Scholar to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded Israel."

2) Leaders who establish order

When the words were spoken, tears turned into joy, and that joy became the strength to obey.

(Neh. 8:10) **"It is your strength to rejoice in the Lord."**

Nehemiah did not end with repentance, but renewed the covenant and taught the next generation the language of the word and the order of worship, paving the way for faith to become life. Ruling is to enter into God's rule and establish the order of God's kingdom in life and community.

There is a confession that flows throughout the book of Nehemiah. **"Remember me, my God."** Nehemiah did not focus on people's evaluations or his own interests, but fixed his gaze on God until the end. It was the holy hand of God that held Nehemiah from beginning to end, and he was written as the one who revealed God's rule until the end.
